Week 2: Transfiguration – no suggested symbols agreed to. A strong light (? Lighthouse, Andre may be able to borrow from St. Leos, although it could be confused with the candle at week 4. The mountain could also be considered as one with the desert and no change may be necessary.

Week 5: Passion Sunday: Palms are the obvious symbol here.

We need to transition to Easter through the Triduum. The altar area needs to be clear for Holy Thursday (washing of the feet) and Good Friday through to late on Holy Saturday prior to the Vigil Mass Two solutions come to mind:

- (1) Remove the scene after Palm Sunday and restore, complete with new flowers, ready for the vigil.
- (2) Remove and discard, and just bring back flowers in the same area.

6.2.2. Stations of the Cross – See version Peter has. Consider for this year if we can get the volunteers, or possibly another year. Music suggestions are a guide only.

## 6.2.3. Good Friday

We will attempt to have similar assistance to ensure that the veneration of the cross flows smoothly. This will limit requirements for music at this time.

It is till advisable that the group doing this service have adequate music to cover large numbers.

## 6.2.4. Vigil: Sung Exsultet - Christian

Which Readings & Psalms. If we do the same as last year, the year before, etc, and we do not cover all the readings over a few years, do we sell out the beauty of the liturgy. If we choose to do the same this year, because of lack of time, can we look towards next year and consider a different set.

Peter suggested that in Cycle A at least, we reflect back on our symbols (Water, light, life) 5<sup>th</sup> reading & Psalm seems appropriate. 7th Psalm is also good.
