Feast Of The Epiphany.

Key Themes: The glory of the Lord shines upon you. He shall rule the world with justice. Every nation will adore Him. All are now parts of the same body. They saw His star and came to adore Him.

- Notes: (1) The word epiphany comes from a Greek word for manifestation or appearance. As Christians, the word has a special meaning: The manifestation of the divine nature of Christ. Traditionally it is occurs 12 days after Christmas, on 6th of January, with readings which reflect Christ's mission to all the world, as represented by the Magi (Matt. 2:1–12). The Catholic Church allocates the feast to the first Sunday after the east of Mary, Mother of God on 1st January.
 - We have held all our "Wise Men" hymns back from Christmas. This is the time to use them. (2)
 - The feast is strongly associated with the Baptism of The Lord, the following week. This is the (3) second "epiphany", the manifestation of Christ at the start of his journey, when he is blessed by the voice of the Father.
